

Fortunately, the older people get married, the longer their marriages last and I am already 41, so we don't have to put up with each other for that long! LOL I do research for my personal improvement workshops and according to the U.S. Census Bureau, the data that has been regurgitated for us by society for years has been crucially damaging to marriages.

Most people get married by age 30 (60% married by 30, only 5% divorced by 30.)
2000 divorce rate 18.5% (which actually included separated and widowed as well)
2008 divorce rate 15% (and 5% were married and divorced by age 30)
2011 divorce rate 49.1%!

Divorce rate only jumped because of people regurgitating lies that the divorce rate was over fifty percent when it actually was not.

Marriage seems to last from ages 29-55, which is 26 years!

If they held out that long, 89.7% will remain married until death!!!!

The percentage of never married is less than 20% at highest rate at age 39.

By age 49 almost 88% of the population gets married with only 10.3% divorce rate.

MOST people in this country DO get and STAY married.

Other Statistics I Collected in 2008:

Median age reached 36.8 in 2008.
